The H.O.G. officers have been busy working on new ideas for chapter participation.

Beginning April 13, we will be holding a meet and greet the H.O.G. members at CHD in the H.O.G. meeting room(past the restrooms) beginning at 10am until noon. So new members come in and meet your fellow chapter members. Donuts and coffee will be served. This will be a monthly meeting. Emails will be going out monthly to remind new and old members.

The first thing we decided is about the Pride Points. Every event, such as socials, breakfasts, dinners, dealership events, etc will earn you pride points. At the end of the year you will be awarded a rocker after you have earned 40 pride points. This year we have upped the prize. After 60 pride points have been earned, your H.O.G. Christmas dinner will be paid for in December. All it takes is your participation and earn those Pride points.

Pride Points earnings is as follows:

Volunteering at Blessing of the Bikes = 10 points

Volunteering at a Dealership special event = 3 points

Attending a Dealership special event = 1 points

Going on a Breakfast Ride = 1 point

Going on a Day Ride = 2 points

Volunteering to be a Day Ride Leader or Sweep = extra 1 point

Going on an overnight ride = 4 points

Going on a two-night overnight ride = 8 points

Ride Leader/Planner in addition to the attendee points = 10 points

(Note: the planner does a lot of work booking hotel and pre-riding the route.)

Serving as a Road Captain/sweep on overnight trips carns an extra 2 points per day.

Attending a Monthly Social = 2 points.

Attending H.O.G. Parties like the Christmas party = 1 point

Attending a H.O.G. special event like trivia or paint, etc. = 1 point

Participating in a Dealership sponsored ride gains 5 points.

Christmas wrapping 3 points per session. Monthly Hosts earn 10 Pride points for each Month they host.

The annual Blessing of the Bikes will be held on April 28th. We need our H.O.G. chapter volunteers to make this a success. Plus remember, that's 10 point pride patch event.

Also last but not least, I have challenged all of the Decatur H.O.G. officers to do a mystery ride that is not on our activities calendar. Each officer will schedule a day ride. No one will know the destination. Only the Officer leading the ride. The officer will let you know how long the ride will be and how far into the ride will we stop. Other than that it's all a mystery. I am sure there will be a good lunch and ice cream stop along the way. Stay tuned for those rides to be announced.

Has everyone heard about Harley Davidson's Membership program the Motor Company came out with last June? It is a tiered loyalty program that people can sign up for, and HOG is the top tier of the program! Download the Harley Davidson app (black box with white B&S outline) in the Play Store (Android) or App Store (Apple), click "Sign In", and use your username and password that you use for the HOG website. If you've never created a username and password on HOG's website, click "Join Now" in the app and use your email address as your username. Under your profile in the app, you can "Add HOG" to link your HOG membership information. Once registered, you'll get points (4 points for every dollar spent) for any purchases in dealerships or at harley davidson.com as long as you use the same email address that you signed up for the Membership program with. That means that if you are ever shopping at a different dealership, (on a road trip, for example) make sure that dealer has your name and email address on file when they check you out. You can also "Check In" at each Harley Davidson dealership once per year for an additional 100 points. (Pro-tip: you can check in from their parking lot, even if they aren' t open!) Dealership events are also eligible for check ins, so make sure to check the app and check in (10 points) while attending dealership events! I've also started making "Events" on the app for HOG Socials, dinner rides, and breakfast rides, so you can check into those for points as well? The location of the event is where the ride starts, so check ins for those will be at the dealership, not the ride destination. There are also Ride Challenges on the app, and you can earn digital badges by participating in them. And don't forget to have dealership staff log your mileage in our system so you get credit for miles ridden (up to 15,000 miles per year!), especially if you have a Harley-Davidson Visa card. You can also link your HD Visa to the app if you'd like, and transfer your points to the app to spend them from there as an alternative to how you've done it in the past. Spending your rewards is easy from the app! Click your profile outline on the top left of the homepage in the app, click on your membership card, and you'll see your points and redeemable credits there. Click redeem and choose the dollar amount you'd like to use, and the dealership staff can scan it from there! Reminder: don't click redeem until you're ready to use it! It starts a running clock so people can't screenshof it and use it in multiple locations, and when that clock runs out your credits go away. Sounds like a lot, and it is! It's a great program that rewards you for riding your motorcycle and doing fun things, what more could you ask for???! 

So far this spring it seems Mother Nature has been toying with the bike riding community as far as the weather is concerned. Warm for two or three days, hopes up, then another hard freeze. Hang in there, riding weather is most definitely on it's way. With riding in min{ we all should be mindful of a few precautions that should be addressed before we set out for that first long awaited ride. Checking our bikes out before getting them out that first time is almost mandatory. Fluid levels, belt tension, lights, turn signals and just a walk around looking for anything that is not supposed to be. And, one more thing that is very important, not only before your first ride of the year, but before every ride throughout the year is checking tire pressure. According to the mechanics at Coziahr's, ninety percent of all bikes that are in for service have UNDER INFLATED tires. If you ever have a tire pressure problem at speed you will NEVER ignore it again. So, do yourself a favor and check the pressure before each ride to increase your safety. Get that inspection done and get ready for some long awaited and much needed wind therapy. Ride safe and enjoy!
